As winter approaches, we will be doing some wonderful things at WHEC to keep our spirits bright! Here are some important dates to remember and participate in:



Please call us at 610-374-0739, ext. 4101 to report your child's absence. You can call at any hour of the day or night to leave a message. Absences are excused **ONLY** when the office receives a note from the parent within 3 days of their student's absence.

## **Dress appropriately**

Winter is coming – wear your hats, mittens and boots when needed. Please notify us if you do not have these items for your children.

## **Student Drop off**

Please do not drop students off prior to 8:30 a.m. We do not open the doors until 8:30 a.m., and we don't want children to be standing in the cold!

## **Car Drop Off Safety**

Please have your student(s) ready to exit your car when you pull up for student drop off. Students must have shoes on and tied, coats on and their books in their back packs. Parents are not to get out of their cars. If your student is not ready to exit the car, please park in the lot and walk with your student to the school door. We also ask that you do NOT pass other cars in the drop off lane. Students should always use the walkway instead of walking between cars or buses. The safety of our students is our top priority and we thank you for your cooperation. Please have your child exit closest to the walkway on the right hand side of the car.

In October, Kindergarten had its first field trip to Brecknock Orchard! We took a hayride around the orchard, learned about how apples grow and even got to pick our own apple to take home!

Many first grade students participated in the Trick or Treat for UNICEF campaign by bringing along collection boxes as they visited neighborhood houses on Halloween. Some students shared that they were donating funds they had collected for doing chores or were donating monetary gifts they had received from family and friends. Our grade level contribution to UNICEF for 2019 was \$106.73. The students have watched videos that explain the work of UNICEF. They have learned that any monetary amount can make a difference in the lives of children around the world. Our donation will enable aid workers to supply a water pump for a village in the developing world and may also fund immunizations. (FYI: 87 cents of every dollar children collected will go directly to children in need. UNICEF keeps administrative costs as low as possible.)

## Grade 2 News...

In November second grade traveled to Allentown to visit the Da Vinci Science Center. We had a great day focusing on a wide variety of STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and math) activities! Each activity taught us something new, but in a fun way. We learned about liquid nitrogen, fluid dynamics, properties of matter, and so much more!

The students spent time exploring many hands-on stations. They crawled through a dark maze to practice using senses other than sight. They also enjoyed a challenging activity called KEVA construction. The students were able to use KEVA planks to create structures. The structures were made by only stacking the KEVA planks. No glue, or connectors were allowed. It was a challenge, but it was fun!

Students also witnessed the Frozen Magic Show, which features magic brought to life by liquid nitrogen. This amazing magic show displays tricks caused liquid nitrogen which exists at negative 321 degrees Farenheit! It was super cold, and super cool!

The students had a great day of learning and exploring. At the end of the Visit, everyone agreed that science is super!





# Grade 3 News

The third grade classes kicked off the ecology unit by heading to the Pioneer Crossing Landfill. At the landfill, we learned what happens to our trash once it leaves our homes. We were shocked to learn that 9 TONS of trash is dumped in the landfill every day. Students learned the difference between landfills and dumps and were excited to find out that our trash provides energy to homes in neighboring communities.

The third graders are working hard on becoming multiplication masters. We know how much they are practicing at home and are excited for the upcoming Fact Frenzy.


The third grade teachers are so proud of the hard work that the students put in each day. We look forward to spreading kindness and cheer together throughout the month of December.

# Fourth Grade "Egg" citing News

Science has been "egg"citing in grade four! Chicken embryology began with the arrival of sixteen fertile eggs for each classroom. Students learned about the growth and development of a chicken embryo and were responsible for turning the eggs, recording the temperature, and checking the humidity of the incubator. After 21 days, our feathered friends hatched. The baby chicks were well cared for by the proud and pleased fourth graders.



In social studies, grade four has been studying early explorers such as Marco Polo, Prince Henry the Navigator, and Amerigo Vespucci. They've learned how these brave men ventured forth, discovering new lands and adding to humans' knowledge of our planet. From there, students will begin to study early New World colonies such as the "Lost Colony" of Roanoke, Jamestown, and Plymouth. In the spring, students will learn about the thirteen colonies and life in colonial America.
